Course Content	This course is an introductory course to Turkish foreign policy and it examines Turkish foreign policy since 1919.
The Aim of the Course	The main aim of this course is to examine the fundamentals of Turkish Foreign Policy from the National Liberation Movement era until today. In doing that, chronologically, it is aimed to analyze the evolution of Turkish foreign policy in parallel with the evolution of the international system. Moreover, it is targeted to examine the foreign policy implementation of decision makers.
Course Outcomes	The expected outcomes of this course are as follows: (1) Informing the students on the implementation of Turkish foreign policy; (2) perceiving the place and role of Turkey in international system; (3) evaluating causality in historical incidents of Turkish foreign policy.
