<b>Course Content</b>	Designed specifically for students in the Department of Political Science and International Relations, this course includes the formation of the nationalist phenomenon, its historical process, and the conceptual development of time-space with an interdisciplinary approach in social sciences. At the same time, in the global, national and regional context, it focuses on various nationalist movements in the direction of case studies, it is evaluated through today's nation state, multiculturalism and other subjects.
<b>The Aim of the Course</b>	The main objective of this course is to create a competent debate on the notion of nationalism that has directly affected social movements, political formations and practices since the seventeenth century. In the first half of the semester, topics such as the meaning of nationalism and connected concepts, the theories of nationalism, the links between state, nation, religion and ideology will be discussed. In the second half of the semester, after mentioning minorities and areas of multiculturalism, it will be concluded with discussions on Turkey. The ultimate aim is to enable students to examine and evaluate some general concepts in their daily conversations and discussions qualitatively and critically.
