Course Content	The course explores the political, economic and social change and transformation of the modern Middle East since the disintegration of the Ottoman Empre until the era of Arab uprisings. It offers a detailed analysis of state formation in the Middle East, the role of external actors in the making of the modern Middle East, the affairs of regional states with external actors and among each other, the major dynamics in state-society relations, the political economy of the region marked by oil, political rent and differential integration to the global economic system as well as different ideologies and forms of identity comprising nationalism, Islamism and pan-Arabism.
The Aim of the Course	The course aims to acquiant students with the fundamental knowledge of the politics, economic development/underdevelopment, sociology and international relations of the Middle East. It hopes to help students to build a perspective on the changes and continuities of the region by linking current tensions and turmoil with their historical origins.
