<b>The Aim of the Course</b>	The course aims to provide a conceptual framework to understand the theory and practice of integration based on the emergence of the European Union from an entity of cooperation in the field of coal and steel among European countries. In this context this course also aims to examine how integration process has impacted on the enlargement of the union as well as its foreign and regional policy.
<b>Course Outcomes</b>	At the end of the course students are expected to be able to; - master integration theories, and the basic concepts European integration - learn the history of the idea of European integration. - understand trans-national integration in the European context - familiarize with the challenges the EU faced in the process of its evolution from an economic to a political union - understand and analyze the European identity and the current debate about the future of European identity
