Notes:

[1] Double Major Directive Article 7.(2) A separate transcript is issued for the second major program. The transcript of the second major includes all courses of the second major program.

[2] Double Major Directive Article 7.(3) The second major program covers all courses of the primary major program of the relevant department. Courses with the same code that are taken in the primary major and are also included in the second major are automatically recorded on the transcript through the Information System. Equivalent courses taken in the primary major may be counted toward the second major program, and equivalent courses taken in the second major program may be counted toward the primary major program. The determination of course equivalency is made by the faculty boards, and the counting of equivalent courses is finalized by a decision of the relevant administrative board. The grade of courses counted in this way is shown on the transcript with the same letter grade.

[3] Double Major Directive Article 9.(5) For a student enrolled in a double major program to graduate from both the primary and the second major programs, the total number of required cooperative education terms to be completed is three. Two of these cooperative education terms are completed within the primary major program and one within the second major program. However, students who are admitted to the double major program in the department offering their minor program after successfully fulfilling the completion requirements of the minor program and completing the three cooperative education obligations in their primary major program are exempt from the cooperative education requirement of the second major program. (Additional sentence: Senate Decision dated 13.01.2014, No. 01/2)

[4] Students whose primary major is International Entrepreneurship are required to complete only one of the OEG 200-300-400 courses as an Economics Department student when enrolled in the Economics double major program. These students are exempt from the other two cooperative education courses.

[5] When transferring horizontally from the International Entrepreneurship Department to the Economics Department or when pursuing a double major in Economics, the courses that may be counted in place of IYD and OE coded courses are as shown in Table 3.

[6] There are 7 departmental electives in the Economics major curriculum. For the Economics double major program, students must take 7 elective courses from among those listed in the table above, according to their preference.

[7] A course taken in the primary major and to be counted as a faculty or university elective in the Economics double major program must be at least 3 credits.

[8] A student whose primary major is within the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences (FEAS) and who is also pursuing a double major in Economics is exempt from the faculty and university elective courses in the Economics curriculum after completing the compulsory courses in their primary major.

[9] A student whose primary major is in a department outside the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences (FEAS) and who is also pursuing a double major in Economics is exempt from the university electives in the Economics curriculum after completing the compulsory courses in their primary major.

[10] If a student whose primary major is in a department outside the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences (FEAS) takes elective courses from FEAS departments in order to meet the curriculum requirements of their primary major, the student is exempt from the same number of faculty elective courses in the Economics double major program as the number of FEAS courses taken in their primary major.

[11] The equivalent course table is used to determine the equivalency between Economics Department courses and compulsory courses taken by double major students in their primary major program or in other departments outside Economics as required by their primary major curriculum. Students whose primary major is Economics cannot benefit from these equivalencies; they cannot take other departments' courses listed in the equivalent course table in place of courses in their own department's curriculum, nor can they show them on the Economics primary major transcript.

[12] Courses listed in the equivalent course table as equivalent to Economics Department courses cannot be taken by students whose primary major is Economics for the purpose of showing them on their primary major transcripts.

[13] In lateral transfers to the Economics Department, the double major equivalent course table is used to determine course equivalencies.
